Pilgrimage to Edinburgh for Venerable Margaret Sinclair: The bus will pick up here around 1230 for those who have signed up. If you are going, you're recommended to take a packed lunch, or have something to eat before you leave. There will be tea and coffee available in Edinburgh.

Pastoral Area Meeting: the priests and lay representatives of the parishes in our pastoral area — ourselves, St Peter's, St Aloysius, and Turnbull Hall — will be meeting this week to begin discussions about the different ways in which we can cooperate and support each other in the work of evangelisation. We will also begin looking at how to serve this area in the future with declining numbers of priests and smaller congregations.

Annual Mission Appeal: on the weekend of 30th September & 1st October we will welcome the Xaverian Missionaries for the annual mission appeal. They will tell us about their work and ask for our prayers and financial support. Please be generous in helping them in their work.

RCIA: one of our most important tasks as Christians is to lead other to follow Christ in the Catholic Church, and the final stage of their journey to Him is the RCIA – the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults – when we lead those wanting to become Catholics through a journey of catechesis, liturgical preparation, and spiritual development that culminates at the Easter Vigil in Baptism or Reception into the Church. This year we are going to be delivering our RCIA programme with St Peter's in Partick as part of our pastoral area collaboration. Please pray for everyone who has expressed an interest in coming to Faith in our area, and for our group leaders who are helping them in that journey towards God and His Church.

October Devotions: in the past we have had Devotions on Sundays at 5pm in May and October. In May the turnout wasn't great, and so we wanted to check if Sundays at 5pm was the best day or time. SPUC: Massive threat to religious freedom – please contact your MSPs. The Abortion Service (Safe Access Zones) Bill, tabled by Gillian MacKay MSP, will soon be debated in Holyrood. This Bill will introduce so-called buffer zones around abortion clinics. It bans prayer in certain areas- as massive attack on religious freedom- and removes a lifeline for women who want to keep their babies but feel they have no other choice than abortion.
