Parish Accounts 2022-2023: We have recently submitted our accounts for the Financial Year 2022-2023. The summary income and expenditure are set out in the table below (please note that sums have been rounded)

You have been very generous with your collections (averaging almost £7 per head per week), and even leaving aside the very kind donation of £10,000 we received (which we intend to spend on improving the church lighting), we still made a surplus of almost £7000 on our ordinary income and expenditure. This will help us offset rising gas and electricity prices in the future, but we will also be looking at ways we can use the money to support evangelisation in our community.

As well as our parish income and expenditure, you also donated £10,146 to the special collections that we have from time to time for diocesan, national, and international charities. Thank you for all your support.
