Looking to the Future:

As part of the Archbishop's plans for the evangelisation of Glasgow each parish has been asked to contribute reflections, ideas, and hopes to our deanery so that the deanery can advise the Archbishop on how best to spread the gospel in this part of Glasgow.

We will be having a parish meeting to discuss this on Tuesday, 9th May at 7pm. All are welcome, and encouraged, to come along and pray, discuss, and contribute to our parish's submission to the deanery.

In advance of the meeting, we are invited to think about some of the following questions.

- How can we best evangelise in this current time? Imagine vibrant, joyful church life within your deanery. Envision life-giving faith experiences that have the power to actively introduce others to the love of Jesus Christ – how do we get there?
- What are your hopes for Catholic life in your community? Where would you love to see new life and vibrancy?
- Where have you seen or experienced good examples of evangelisation and outreach?
- Where have you seen or experienced good examples to evangelise young people?
- In what ways could we encourage people to deepen their existing relationship with Jesus Christ?
- Are there things we could do to introduce people to the love of Jesus Christ for the first time?
- In what ways we well-positioned to act on their faith by serving those in need within your local community?
- What formation and/or education of priests and laity do you consider necessary to achieve the vision in your area?

No parish can do all these things on their own, we need to learn to work together with our neighbours to spread the good news. None of us can ignore the challenges that we face as Catholics in Glasgow today, we must either take up the challenge and confidently share our faith or accept quietly fading away. **Weekday Masses:** Canon Gargaro is away at the annual conference of the Canon Law Society in Galway this week ("Its work, honest!") and so Mass on Monday will be at **9am**, there will be no Mass Tuesday to Thursday, and Mass on Friday will be at **7pm**. Apologies for the inconvenience.

May Devotions: start next Sunday and take place each Sunday in May at 5pm.

First Communion Preparation: continues after 10am Mass for the pupils and parents in P4 until the First Communion Mass on Saturday 13th May at 10am. Please pray for the children and their parents as they prepare for this great celebration in their lives as Catholics.

Exhibition of Eucharistic Miracles: takes place in Corpus Christi, Scotstounhill, 28th-30th April. All welcome.

Wayside Club: thank you for your donations so far. Looking forwards we need now to collect tins of soup, ravioli, tuna, spaghetti, and beans. We also need to collect men's disposable razors. Please be generous in helping out.

Vocation Sunday: Today is Good Shepherd Sunday when we pray for vocations to the priesthood and religious life, that God may grant young people in our city the call to follow Him and that the young people of Glasgow will hear and answer that call.

Coronation of King Charles: the Bishops have asked us to pray next Saturday for the King and for our country.

Traditional Latin Mass: is available in St Brigid's, Toryglen, every Sunday at 9.30am, and the parish priest there, Fr Byrne, has been appointed as the coordinator for the pastoral care of those attached to the older form of the Mass, as used before 1970.
