Deanery Council: The Deanery Council met on Tuesday. We spent some time in prayer, then, after introducing ourselves, met in small groups to discuss evangelisation, collaboration, and resources across the deanery. There was a lot of agreement about ideas in general, albeit, as we would expect, with lots of different thoughts about what practical things any given parish would like to – or be able to – do. The Dean and the lay co-chair of the Council will now try and draw up a report to send to the Archdiocese, based on the feedback from our individual parish meetings and the council meeting. Hopefully we'll get the chance to share that report here in the parish.

Hospital Pastoral Care: please see notice on notice board about our pastoral care of hospitals. Remember (a) if you know you are going in to hospital and want Confession and the Sacrament of the Sick please ask Canon Gargaro before you go, (b) if you are taken in as an emergency ask the nurse to contact the on-call chaplain or call the parish, and (c) if you are in hospital for a longer time you can receive Holy Communion regularly in the ward, but only if you ask the nurse or contact the parish. The chaplains will not be told you are in hospital and cannot visit you automatically – you must specifically ask to see the Catholic chaplain.

P5 Visit to Church: Mr McCartan gave P5 a tour of the church last Monday. Here is some feedback from the children:

Assisted Dying: What does it all mean? Saturdays 10th, 17th and 24th June 2023 at 2pm at St Aloysius Church, Garnethill, in the Ogilvie Centre. Liam McArthur MSP is proposing a bill to legalise assisted dying. This will undermine the right to life and put vulnerable people at risk of coming under pressure to end their lives prematurely. A series of Holyrood Webinars on Assisted Dying, Euthanasia and Palliative Care will be shown featuring Professor Marie Fallon, University of Edinburgh, Dr Miro Griffiths, University of Leeds, Dr. Leonie Herx, Queens University, Kingston, Canada and Tanni Grey Thompson, television presenter and former wheelchair racer. Discussion will follow and Gordon McDonald, CEO of Care not Killing will be in attendance. All are welcome.

Linn Cemetery Mass: This year's Linn Cemetery Mass will take place on Saturday 10th June at 3pm. Fr Ian Bathgate will be the main celebrant.

Annual Pilgrimage to Scalan: The Annual Pilgrimage to Scalan takes place on Sunday 2nd July with Mass outdoors at The Scalan beginning promptly at 4.00pm. Scalan can be found a mile beyond Chapeltown of Glenlivet. An approximate postcode is AB37 9JS. Coaches need to stop half a mile beyond Chapeltown. Cars and minibuses can park very near and are usually willing to take anyone needing a lift.

St. Andrew's Cathedral Bookshop and Welcome Hub: In a spirit of evangelisation, St Andrew's Cathedral would like to establish a bookshop and information hub to assist visitors to the Cathedral. To do this we need volunteers who would be willing to serve in the bookshop, perhaps offering tours of the Cathedral, along with a friendly face. Working in pairs each volunteer would be prepared, supported and invited to accept a two-hour slot each week.
